Saturdays, December 3, 10, 17, 2022, 5–9 pm Sundays, December 4, 11, 18, 2022, 4–8 pm



This daylong event in the TYCO Visitors Center features storytelling "concerts" or performances by five experienced Indigenous storytellers as well as a keynote address. Gayle Ross (Cherokee), Dawnland Storyfest 2022 keynote speaker, is a direct descendant of Principal Chief John Ross.

Strawbery Banke announces the naming of the Kennebunk Savings Terrace

Strawbery Banke Museum announced the naming of the Kennebunk Savings Terrace on Tuesday, August 9 in a ribbon-cutting and dedication ceremony honoring one of the primary donors who enabled its upgrade and expansion. At the ceremony, representatives from Kennebunk Savings presented Lawrence J. Yerdon, President and CEO, and Cynthia Fenneman, Chair of the Board of Trustees, with a check for \$50,000.

The effort to expand and create a more accessible year-round space began earlier this year with Rink Services Group issuing the "Keep Skating Accessible" \$5,000 match challenge fundraiser over the Martin Luther King Jr. Day weekend in February. Donors raised \$13,421, including matching funds from RSG over three days, earmarked toward expanding the rink patio and making it a permanent structure.

Additional improvements to the Kennebunk Savings Terrace include replacing the existing outdoor furniture with ADA Compliant tables and chairs, planters on wheels that can be moved for functions, as well as significant electrical upgrades to the outdoor space, including new exterior lighting. Additionally, a non-permanent covering will be installed at a later date to offer shade during the warmer months.
